4. Setting the Stage

Background of the capital campaign:

- Current building constructed in 1956; only partially renewed in 2004
- Engineering reports in 2021 and 2022
- Feasibility study in spring/summer 2022
- Final report recommendations & decisions of Sisters in August 2022

Campaign Timeline:

- January-April 2023 Quiet Phase: Lead gifts, Foundations
- April-May 2023
- Associate/Oblate/Friends campaign
- June-September 2023 General campaign

Construction Timeline

- January 2024
- January 2025

Hope to begin construction – Guest House closed Hope to re-open



5. Why Renew the Guest House?

- Hospitality a core ministry of the Sisterhood since its founding; our houses have always been "a home for the heart"
- The only Anglican retreat centre left in the country
- An oasis for the spiritually hungry and those in need of rest and prayer
- A meeting and learning place for parishes and other groups
- The venue for SSJD's Food for the Soul programs
- A sacred space and spiritual home for people of all faiths and none
- Offers accommodation for staff, and for families of patients at SJR and Sunnybrook Bayview campus – sometimes for discharged patients as well



6. The Renovations

- New accessible entrance
- Replace "stall" bathrooms with full 3-piece bathrooms
- More accessible bedrooms and baths
- Easy-to-use casement windows
- Life safety systems
- Roof
- Heating/cooling system
- More space in bedrooms
- New flooring throughout



7. Principles Behind the Renovations

- Accessibility
- Environmentally friendly heating and cooling
- Environmentally sensitive materials (floors, fabrics, etc.)
- Security
- User-friendly
- Ease of maintenance and housekeeping
